- 15. We must ensure that our youths develop holistically if we want continued stability. They must be easily adaptable to survive during trying times. They must be loaded with the right kind of knowledge and tools to prepare them for any possibilities in the future.

- 19. Therefore, I hope our international guests will be back to experience other wonderful places in Sarawak and perhaps we could also come and visit your countries and learn from you.
